

I'm Free

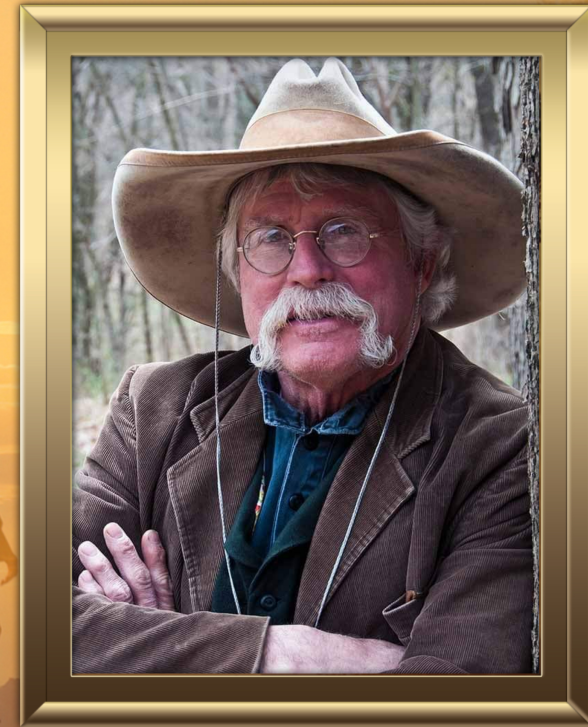
Don't grieve for me, for now I'm free
